**ABSTRACT:**

Researchers are calling for increased studies with regard to differences between older men and women drivers. This literature review focuses on gender comparisons for self-regulation of driving and driving cessation. We reviewed twenty articles and assigned levels of evidence. Seven studies were level II (e.g., prospective cohort) and thirteen were level III (e.g., cross-sectional). Subsequently, five evidence-based recommendations (four grade "C" and one grade "D") were made to address gender specific needs of older men and women. Additional research can potentially clarify gender patterns for self-regulation and cessation and increase the level of evidence supporting gender specific driving interventions.
